SHOW AND TELL








Mason Logie had a very interesting kit model of a railroad barge cabin scow that he saw at the Model Railroad store in Piscataway. As Mason told us, when he saw it, he just had to buy it! The kit is made by American Model Builders and is in HO scale. It's a well designed and engineered kit and so far has been an easy build. Mason airbrushed the hull and got some tips on weathering techniques for the deck and has already got ideas for the type of deck cargo he wants to add.





The meeting adjourned at 9:30 PM




