## MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING June 27, 2006

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 PM by President **Jeff Fuglestad** with 24 members and 1 guest in attendance, **Bob Markovic**, attending his third meeting. Bob was unanimously voted in as a member – welcome aboard, Bob!

The order of business was altered to allow Mason Logie and his guest speaker, Vic Campbell, to offer their presentation on the USS Houston and the Navy's Asiatic Fleet at the start of the meeting.

President Fuglestad requested comments and/or corrections to the June 2006 Broadaxe. There was one correction to be made regarding the number of registrants attending the North East Conference. The final number of attendees was 111. The June Broadaxe had reported a preliminary count of 113. The membership voted to accept the Broadaxe as corrected into the minutes.

Jeff Fuglestad then commented on a financial report on the Conference he will be providing to the other clubs participating in the North East Conference. Jeff reminded the members that it had been mutually agreed among the clubs that any funds in excess of \$100.00 would be distributed to the participating clubs. Jeff reported that there was a small surplus (under \$60.00) after paying off all of the expenses for the speaker, meal costs at the Conference Center and other incidental expenses. A discussion followed covering such topics as the quality of the speaker (highly rated), poor attendance by the public, organization and layout of the displays and the amount of work involved in hosting such an event.

**Tom McGowan** provided the members with a specific drop off date for models to be displayed at the South Amboy Library. He has arranged with the librarian to open the library on Saturday, July 8<sup>th</sup> from approximately 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM. (the library is closed on Saturdays during the summer). An announcement of this drop off date was made via email to the membership prior to publication of this issue of the Broadaxe.

**Michael Storch**, our club Archivist, advised the members present that he has access to a high speed

scanner for a short time and would be happy to scan any documents that a member might have. Interested members should contact Michael directly.

Al Geigel informed the members of a revision to our upcoming hosting of the NRG Conference. Al was advised by the NRG that we will be co-hosting the NRG Conference in 2011, not 2010 as previously scheduled.

Registration forms for the South Street Seaport Museum 14<sup>th</sup> annual Ship & Boat Model Festival to be held on August 5 & 6, 2006 from 1-5pm were made available at the meeting. The registration form is due July 28, 2006. Any forms received after July 21 will not be included in the brochure. Interested persons may contact David Valentin at 212-748-8738.

**Mason Logie, Jr.** received further information on the NYC Fireboat *Harvey* harbor tour. Mason has recommended the date of August 26, 2006 for the tour. It coincides with an appreciation day event being held for the *Harvey*, so other activities will be available.

**Jim Caulkins** informed the members that New Jersey's tall ship, *A.J. Meerwald*, will be at Liberty State Park from July 14<sup>th</sup> through July 29<sup>th</sup>. There are a number of public sailings available as well as daily tours of the vessel. Please call 973-539-7547 to make reservations or obtain further information.

**Gary Kingzett** was contacted by the Elmwood Park Library regarding a future model display similar to the Belskie Museum show. Gary asked if this would be of interest to the members. Jeff Fuglestad said it would be and directed Gary to follow up with the library for further details.

Michael Storch and Larry Friedlander offered an interesting suggestion. They asked if members would be willing to open their workshops on a Saturday to fellow members as a type of on location tech session so we can see how other modelers layout their modeling workshop. There was a good bit of interest in the idea and several members were willing to participate. Jeff Fuglestad suggested that this could take place sometime in the fall as this would allow time to make the work area presentable.



### **SHOW AND TELL**

**Tony Alworth** brought in his nearly completed cat boat. Tony has some minor deck fittings yet to attach to complete the work on the hull and then it's on to the mast.





**Don Otis** brought in a partially completed hull of the British J Class racing yacht, *Endeavour*, in need of repair, which had been started in 1935 and was left unfinished. Don is completing the model for the son of the man who started the model and never finished it. He will be using parts from the Amati kit of the same model which happens to be approximately the same scale (1:35). The hull is of bread and butter construction.





**TECH SESSION** 

Mason Logie, Jr. started off the tech session with his slide presentation of his dive on the USS Houston. Mason recounted his long trip to Indonesia, the local officials' suspicions that he might be looking to steal treasures from the shipwrecks and his search and discovery of the wreck. It was a fascinating story. The highlight of his trip was 'flying' an American flag from the topmast of the Houston and bringing it back and presenting it to the USS Houston survivors association and showing them his slides of the wreck. After Mason's slide presentation, Vic Campbell, a Navy veteran of the Vietnam war, gave a talk on the Asiatic Fleet, the "Forgotten Fleet". It was very informative. Vic had dvd's available for purchase which he had put together using what little film was available on the Asiatic Fleet and the battle of the Java Sea. Vic's dvd is called "The Last Stand". Vic also had a hand out of a talk he gave at a recent Asiatic Fleet Reunion which included a number of additional sources for information on this fleet. October 24, 2006 - Bring a Model Night


